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Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers

We have had another busy week, our year 3 children attended a multisport event at Park School. They had a fantastic time and participated in a range of activities with enthusiasm and enjoyment. The first group of year 5 and 6 swimmers have completed their lessons. Of these, 16 children can swim the required 25m or more and the others will be receiving further top-up lessons in the summer.



The children have celebrated Restart a Heart Day, with all monies raised going towards the maintenance of our community defibrillator. During a visit by the South West Ambulance Service, the children were introduced to basic first aid skills and what to do in an emergency. On Wednesday, we had our annual harvest assembly. We have a huge collection of food to deliver to the Freedom Centre today. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this worthy cause.

Do you use your car Safety Door?

Several parking issues have been drawn to our attention by our local community this week. Please remember that it is safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, which is the one furthest away from passing traffic. It has been reported that some parents are allowing their children to alight from their vehicles from the door closest to passing traffic. This is not only a safety risk for your children and yourselves but also causes an obstruction to passing vehicles and other road users. Please make sure your children leave the car from the pavement side of your vehicle to keep them and yourselves safe.

Use of the turning circle

Although we encourage parents to use the turning circle as a safe place to drop children off, we have noticed parents are stopping in the middle of the turning circle blocking it for other drivers. When dropping your child off please ensure you pull up to the curb, leaving plenty of room for other cars, deliveries, and taxis to pass by. Please could we ask you not to park on the turning circle and leave your vehicle, unless you are a blue badge holder or a taxi.

Nasal Flu Vaccination Programme

As you are aware, nasal flu vaccinations are being offered by the NHS Vaccination Team to children in Reception to Year 6 at Orchard Vale on Monday, 6th November. You have been sent an email with a link to an electronic form which must be completed either providing your consent or declining this. Please be assured that if you do not consent to your child having the vaccination, and have declined this via the online link, the NHS staff will not administer the vaccination in school.


