We are the Mental Health Support Team for schools in North Devon, and we work for Children and Family Health Devon, part of the NHS. We are an award-winning early intervention service for children and young people, supporting schools to raise awareness of Mental Health, reduce stigma around asking for support, and providing families with targeted support at an earlier stage of mental health difficulty.

We support your school to develop a Whole School Approach to mental health, and we take referrals for either 1:1 or small group interventions to address mild to moderate mental health needs such as anxiety or low mood.

A 'Whole School Approach' means thinking about how every part of school life – people, environments, timetables and parents and carers, can work together to develop a mentally healthy place to learn and work; one that promotes positive wellbeing and where students are supported to be happy, resilient, and healthy young people.

We will be available in the Coffee Cabin from 8.15am-9am on Wednesday 2¹⁴ April. Which will give a relaxed and informal chance to meet some of the team and hear more about what we can offer.
